
What's the Buzz?

Rhombus

A rhombus is shaped like a diamond and has four sides that are all the same length. It has four angles, too.

To take in or soak up.

Amphibian

An animal with thin, moist skin that lives part of its life in water and part of its life on land.

Amplify

To make something louder.

Animal

Any living thing that can breathe, eat, grow, and move around.

Apple

A fruit

Things that are underneath the skin and help support the whole body.

Camouflage

To disguise or hide by blending into the background.

Cloud

A cloud is made of tiny drops of water and floats in the sky.

Flower

The part of the plant that has petals. Many flowers have sweet smells and pretty colors.

Fragile

Something that is easily broken.

Frost

Thin layer of ice.

Fruit

Something that grows on a plant or a tree and holds seeds. Many fruits are sweet and good to eat.

Garden

A place where plants, flowers, fruits, and vegetables are grown.

Habitat

A place where something lives and eats and sleeps.

Inflate

To fill something with air.

Ingredient

One of the things that make up a recipe.

Insect

A small bug that has 6 legs, 2 antennae on its head, and sometimes has wings.

To do things that will help you find the answer to your question

Lily

A type of flower

Liquid

Something that flows and takes the shape of any container.

Lizard

An animal that usually has a long body and tail, four short legs, and rough, dry skin.

Magnify

To make something look larger

Mango

A fruit

Metamorphosis

When something goes through a really big change, like when a caterpillar changes into a butterfly.

Moss

A plant that grows on rocks and can grow just about anywhere that is a little wet and shaded. Moss feels soft.

Nature

Plants, animals, and other things outside that are not made by people.

Observe

To look closely at something to find out more.

Prickly

When something has sharp points on it that can stick you.

Senses

You have five senses—sight, hearing, smell, taste, and touch—by which you experience the world around you.

Shadow

A dark shape that is created when a light shines on something.

Shaggy

All covered in fur.

Sleeting

When frozen rain falls

Soggy

Something that is very wet.

Spiderweb

A net of silky thread that a spider makes to rest in and catch things to eat.

Sturdy

Something that is strong and won't fall apart.

Succulent

Juicy

Tadpole

A small animal with a round body and long tail that lives in water and becomes a frog or toad.

Vehicle

Something that can bring people or things from one place to another.

Windy

When it is a windy day, the air is blowing really fast.



Artist

Someone who makes or does creative, special things such as paint, dance, or play a musical instrument.

Blend

To mix different colors together to make a new color

Choreographer

Someone who puts together a dance or makes up dance moves

Clay

A material that can be made into different shapes when wet and used to make things like bowls and flower pots.

Collage

A piece of art that is made with different materials (such as paper) to make a big picture.

Combine

When you blend or mix two or more things together.

Curly

Something that's twisting and wavy, such as hair or a ribbon.

Drum

A musical instrument.

Fuchsia

Red-purple color.

Guitar

A musical instrument with strings that is played with your fingers or a pick.

Inspiration

A big idea

A special kind of stick with a rounded end that you use to hit a drum!

Mask

Something you wear over your face to change the way you look.

Melody

A group of musical notes that make a pleasing pattern or song. Another word for melody is tune.

Museum

A place where you go to see collections of interesting things, such as paintings and sculptures.

Musician

A person who writes, sings, or plays music.

Opaque

Something that does not let light through, so you cannot see through

Orchestra

A large group of musicians playing different kinds of musical instruments together.

Painting

A picture made by using paints.

Palette

A flat board where artists put the paint they're going to use.

Percussion

A percussion instrument is one that you hit—usually with your hand or a stick—or sometimes shake.

Pirouette

To spin around or rotate on one foot or on the points of the toes, as in ballet dancing.

Portrait

A drawing or painting of an actual person.

Rhythm

A beat that happens in a pattern.

Sculpture

A piece of art that is made by shaping or carving something, or by putting things together. It can be made of clay, wood, stone, metal, or many other materials.

Shiny

Smooth and bright.

Splatter

A splash of something on something else.

Texture

The way something feels when you touch it.

Theater

A place you can go to see a play or a movie or another kind of show.

Transparent

Something that is clear so you can see through it, like glass.

Tune

A group of musical notes that make a nice sound. Another word for tune is melody.

Turquoise

A greenish blue color

Unique

One of a kind.

Vibrant

Colors that are bright and really stand out.

Xylophone

A musical instrument that has wooden bars. The bars make different sounds when hit with wooden hammers.
